Headteachers Award

On Tuesday 4th July at the Sheffield Schools Get Active Awards evening, Mr Watson was a joint winner of the Leadership in an Active School Award.

Rising through positions from a teacher, Assistant Head, Deputy Head and finally Headteacher; PE, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) is something that has always been championed by Michael Watson during his time at Hunter's Bar Junior School (as well as in his previous position at Reignhead Primary).

Coming from a mixed sporting background himself, movement and the relationship to progress in the classroom is something that Has always been given high value at Hunter's Bar (HBJS). For this reason, a specialist PE role was set up and developed for Paul Ryan who worked at the school from 2011 – 2017 (becoming a full time PE specialist in 2013) under the guidance of Michael and the ex Headteacher Jill Hallsworth. This role helped to highlight the importance of PESSPA throughout the whole school. Pupils' ownership of clubs also developed with Just Dance and Jammy Dodgers (dodgeball) clubs becoming pupil favourites.

During 2013-2017 HBJS was identified as a successful practitioner within the field of physical education and sport and was invited to join the Youth Sport Trust Innovation School network (one of four primary schools in England) implementing an investigation into Improving Attitudes to Editing and Improving Writing Through Physical Education and Sport. Alongside this, HBJS gained selection as one of only six primary schools involved in the YST Ambassador Schools programme. Initiatives spearheaded by Paul and Michael lead to the school being given a Yorkshire Sport Foundation Centre of Excellence accreditation.

To build upon the excellent work that had been done, Michael recruited Babajide Adebola into the full time PE role in 2019, allowing him to mould PE and develop club links (over 25 external sporting providers) to create pathways into competitive sport for pupils at HBJ.

Since 2019, HBJS has helped in the development of sporting curriculums for the Youth Sport Trust and The FA., has achieved the Platinum School Games Mark award, won the School Games Award (Westfield School Games Hub) at the Sheffield Schools Get Active Awards, seen Clive Fairweather win the Sports Volunteer of the Year Award (Sheffield Federation for Schools Sport), developed the SEND sporting provision through Points Learning Network/Links School Sports Partnership, developed swimming for Y4 pupils with swimming occurring all the way through the academic year, become a PESSPA champion School helping PE Leads in other schools develop their knowledge and practice and become an FA Wildcats centre providing opportunities for female footballers to develop their skills - and is still the only primary school within Sheffield to be a Wildcats centre.

Whilst entrusting Babajide to continue to develop PESSPA within HBJS, Michael is always actively involved in ensuring anything done in a sporting capacity is the right fit for the school and all its pupils – as well as attending sporting events on evenings and weekends to cheer on and support pupils. Success in sporting competitions continues to happen but more importantly ensuring pupils are able to access sport and clubs has become a major focus. Pupil Premium/Free School Meals children pay 0-50% (maximum) for any clubs within HBJ and externally to ensure that they also have access to these Sporting opportunities.

This overview of ensuring opportunities are provided for pupils lead to (in 2021/22) 55% of the school taking part in an Enrichment Activity (e.g. Bikeability) or an After-School/Lunchtime club, 96% of Y4&6 pupils attending Castleton & Thornbridge residentials, 93% of pupils taking part in Sports Day (off site), and HBJS entering 57 of the sporting activities/festivals/matches offered (out of 63), with 61% of the school representing HBJS at sporting competitions and 81% of pupils on the inclusion register representing HBJS over the academic year. Michael has already tasked Babajide with improving on these figures in the 2022/23 academic year!

Whilst entrusting his PE Leads to raise the profile of PESSPA within HBJS, Michael has always had an active role in supporting PESSPA initiatives. Learning for life is the school's motto and Michael believes that there is a sport out there for every child, it's all about them being able to find it, which is something he looks to support here at Hunter's Bar Juniors.











Points Network Games. . . .

On Tuesday 16th March a group of thirty pupils (made up of year 3 and 4 pupils) from Hunters Bar Juniors went across to the English Institute of Sport to take part in the Points Learning Network, Network Games.

The Network Games is an inclusive event where school teams of 30 are split into 3 teams of 10 who compete against each other. The winning team score is then put forward to compete against the other schools top scores and they are ranked for the final presentation.

There are ten different active stations (with two rest stations where pupils could recharge and grab a drink): Don't Stop Running, Long Jump, Foam Javelin, Obstacle Relay, Speed Bounce, Target Throw, Blaze Pods (new this year and non-scoring), Basketball Slalom, Speed Stack (non-scoring) and Boccia (non-scoring).

All of our Year 3 and 4 pupils had a brilliant time with the Blaze Pod station being a real hit as well as the Jumbo Cups Speed Stacks station! (Which you may have seen at Sports Day). It was amazing to see all the smiles on their faces! and HBJ came 8th out of 11 schools. Our three teams (named by the pupils "Chocolate Bars", "Seven Hunters" and our highest scoring team, Hunter's Arrows) were a combination of Y3 and Y4 pupils with the Year 4 pupils taking an active role to help support our

Year 3 pupils.

Continuing on the legacy of the Women's Euros, 5 Y5 girls were given the opportunity to attend the Primary Girls Football Leadership /Activator Training. This helps provide young leaders with their first steps into football leadership and for them to return to school to deliver football based activities to peers. The girls went to EIS for a full day to train with Sheffield United Community Foundation coaches. This was beneficial for the girls as it gave them a great experience of competitive sport. Within the day the girls were able to bring back useful drills which they can then teach to the other girls who love the sport.

The girls took the training in their stride and came up with an action plan (together with Mr Hewson) to run a girls football club on a Thursday lunchtime 12:30pm-1:00pm. The girls use Wednesday lunchtime as a day to plan sessions From fun tiggy games, to skill development and matches to develop rules and tactics awareness.

"The idea of this is to raise football spirit in Hunters Bar to encourage playing football. We know a lot of girls that love the sport but are too afraid to play, either just because they're anxious or because of sometimes playing in front of the boys". "This club is a helpful encouragement club for girls to feel confident to play football against and with the boys".

Effie (along with Hannah who didn't take the training) also helped Mr Adebola with a successful application to win a free girls football kit & Nike hijabs through the Premier League Primary Stars initiative! This amazing work will help in continuing to raise the profile of girls football here at Hunter's Bar.
